



# **Getting Started**

# **Getting to Know Your Phone**





#### **Key Functions**

Key	Function	
Power key	Press and hold to turn airplane mode on or off, restart, or power off. Press to turn on/off the screen display.	
Home key	<ul> <li>Touch to return to the home screen from any application or screen.</li> <li>Touch and hold to use Google Assistant.</li> </ul>	
Recent apps key	<ul> <li>Touch to see recently used applications.</li> <li>Double-tap to switch to the most recent application.</li> </ul>	
Back key	Touch to go to the previous screen.	
Volume key	Press or hold either end of the key to turn the volume up or down.	



You can switch the positions of the **Back** key and the **Recent** apps key. Swipe up on the home screen and touch > **Features > Navigation keys** to select one option.

# Installing the nano-SIM Card and the microSDXC<sup>™</sup> Card (Optional)

The nano-SIM card can be installed or removed while the phone


is turned on.

A microSDXC card can be installed or removed while the phone is turned on. You need to unmount the microSDXC card before removing it.


#### WARNING!

To avoid damage to the phone, do not use any other kind of SIM cards, or any non-standard nano-SIM card cut from a SIM card. You can get a standard nano-SIM card from your service provider.

 Insert the tip of the tray eject tool into the hole next to the card tray.



Pull out the card tray and place the nano-SIM card and the microSDXC card on the tray, as shown. Carefully slide the tray back into place.



### **Charging the Phone**

Your phone's battery should have enough power for the phone to turn on, find a signal, and make a few calls. You should fully charge the battery as soon as possible.

# WARNING!

Use only ZTE-approved chargers and USB Type-C cables. The use of unapproved accessories could damage your phone or cause the battery to explode.

#### WARNING!

Do not remove the back cover. The battery is not removable. Removal may cause fire or explosion.

1. Connect the adapter to the charging jack.



- 2. Connect the charger to a standard AC power outlet. If the phone is on, you'll see a charging icon, such as appear in the status bar.
- 3. Disconnect the charger when the battery is fully charged.



#### NOTE:

If the battery is extremely low, you may be unable to power on the phone even when it is being charged. In this case, try again after charging the phone for at least 20 minutes. Contact customer service if you still cannot power on the phone after prolonged charging.

#### **Extending the Battery Life**

Active applications, screen brightness levels, *Bluetooth* and Wi-Fi usage, and GPS functionality can drain your battery. You can follow the helpful tips below to conserve your battery power:

- Reduce the screen backlight time.
- Lower the screen brightness.
- Turn Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and auto-sync off when not in use.
- Disable the GPS function when not in use. Most applications using this function will periodically query the GPS satellites for your current location; each query drains your battery.
- · Use the Battery saver feature.

# **Powering Your Phone On/Off**

- Press and hold the Power key to turn on your phone.
- To turn it off, press and hold the Power key to open the options menu and touch Power off.

# Setting Up Your Phone for the First Time

When you first power on your phone after you purchase it or reset it to factory settings (see <u>Reset Options</u>), you need to do some settings before using it. Select the language and then follow the on-screen prompts to set up your phone.

# Locking/Unlocking the Screen and **Kevs**

Your phone allows you to quickly lock the screen and keys (put the phone to sleep mode) when not in use and also to turn the screen back on and unlock it when you need it.

#### Lock the Screen and Keys

To quickly turn the screen off and lock the keys, press the **Power** kev.



To save battery power, the phone automatically turns off the screen after a certain period of time when you leave it idle. You will still be able to receive messages and calls while the phone screen is off.

#### Unlock the Screen and Kevs

- Press the Power key to turn the screen on.
- 2. Swipe up on the screen.
  - or -

Swipe from voice assistant, or swipe from to open the camera.

- or -

Touch a notification twice consecutively to open the related app.

# NOTE:

If you have set an unlock pattern, a PIN, or a password for your phone (see <u>Protecting Your Phone With Screen Locks</u>), you'll need to swipe up on the screen and then draw the pattern or enter the PIN/password to unlock the screen.

# **Using the Touch Screen**

Your phone's touch screen lets you control actions through a variety of touch gestures.

- Touch When you want to type using the on-screen keyboard, select on-screen items (such as application and settings icons), or press on-screen buttons, simply touch them with your finger.
- Touch and Hold To open the available options for an item (for example, a message or link in a web page), touch and hold the item.
- Swipe or Slide To swipe or slide means to quickly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.
- Drag To drag, press and hold your finger with some pressure before you start to move your finger. While dragging, do not release your finger until you have reached the target position.
- Pinch In some apps (such as Maps, browser, and Gallery), you can zoom in and out by placing two fingers on the screen

- at once and pinching them together (to zoom out) or spreading them apart (to zoom in).
- Rotate the Screen For most screens, you can automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways.

#### NOTES:

- The Auto-rotate feature needs to be enabled for the screen orientation to automatically change. Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Display, and switch on Auto-rotate screen
- You can also access the screen rotation control by sliding down the status bar twice and touching Auto-rotate or Portrait.

# **Getting to Know the Home Screen**

The home screen is the starting point for your phone's applications, functions, and menus. You can customize your home screen by adding application icons, shortcuts, folders, widgets, and more.



#### **Extended Home Screen Panels**

Your home screen is extendable, providing more space for applications, shortcuts, widgets, and more. Simply swipe left or right on the home screen to see the extended panels. You can add or remove home screen panels, or adjust their order.

#### To add a new home screen panel:

Touch the Home key to access the home screen.

Touch and hold an item such as a shortcut, a folder or a widget on the screen and drag it to the right edge of the screen to create a new home screen panel and put the item on it.

#### NOTE:

No empty home screen panel is allowed to exist. If the shortcut, folder or widget is the only item on the current home screen panel, the panel will be deleted as you remove the item.

#### To move a home screen panel:

- Touch and hold an empty area of the home screen and slide left or right to view the home screen thumbnails.
- Touch and hold a thumbnail and drag it left or right to the place you need.

#### To delete a home screen panel:

- Touch and hold an empty area of the home screen and slide left or right to view the home screen thumbnails.
- Touch X on the top right corner of a home screen thumbnail
- 3. Touch OK. The items on the panel will also be removed.

#### NOTE:

Touch at the top of a home screen thumbnail to set it as the main home screen.

# Personalizing

# **Changing the System Language**

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > System > Languages & input > Languages. The first language in the list is the default system language.
- 2. Touch Add a language and then the language you need.
- Touch and hold a language and move it to the top to switch to that language.

# NOTE:

To remove languages from the list, touch > Remove and select the languages you want to delete, and then touch > OK.

# **Setting the Date and Time**

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > System > Date & time.
- 2. Set the date, time, time zone, and time format.
  - To adjust the date and time automatically, touch to turn on Automatic date & time.
  - To adjust the date and time manually, touch to turn off
     Automatic date & time and touch Set date / Set time to

- change the date and time.
- To adjust the time zone automatically, touch to turn on Automatic time zone.
- To adjust the time zone manually, touch to turn off Automatic time zone and touch Select time zone to set the correct time zone.
- To adjust the time format, touch to turn on/off Use 24-hour format.

# Changing the Ringtone, Notification Sound, and Alarm Sound

You can customize the default ringtone for incoming calls, the default notification sound, and the default alarm sound.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Sound > Ringtones.
- Touch Phone ringtone, Default notification sound, or Default alarm sound.
- Scroll through the list and select the ringtone you'd like to use. You can touch **Add ringtone** to add additional audio files to the list
- 4. Touch OK

# **Turning System Sounds On/Off**

 Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Sound > Advanced. 2. Touch the switch beside each option to turn it on or off.

#### **Adjusting Volumes**

- 1. Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Sound.
- Drag the sliders below Media volume, Alarm volume, Ring volume, and Notification volume to adjust the volume for each type of audio.

#### NOTE:

You can adjust the volume levels any time by pressing the **Volume** key. Then touch  $\checkmark$  and drag a volume slider.

# **Switching to Silent or Vibration Mode**

You can set the phone to silent or vibration mode by using one of the following methods.

- Press the Volume key when no media application is active to show the volume management window. Drag the slider to the left or keep pressing the Volume down key to switch the phone to vibration mode. Press the key again in vibration mode to switch the phone to silent mode.
- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Sound > Notification mode and select Vibrate or Mute to switch to vibration or silent mode.
- Swipe down from the top of the screen to open the notification panel and drag the panel downwards. Touch Sound, Vibrate, or Slient to switch the phone to vibration or silent mode or

turn on the sound. See Use Quick Settings.

#### NOTES:

- Silent and vibration modes will not silence your alarms.
- To restore normal sound settings, press and hold the Volume up key.

# **Using Do Not Disturb Mode**

You can limit interruptions with Do not disturb mode. This mode silences your phone so that it doesn't make sounds or vibrate when you don't want it to.

#### Turn On Do Not Disturb Mode

- Swipe down from the top of the screen with two fingers to access the Quick Settings.
- 2. Touch Do not disturb.

#### NOTES:

- Press the Volume key when no media application is active to show the volume bar. Drag the slider to the left or keep pressing the Volume down key to turn on vibration. Press the key again to turn on Alarms only.
- To turn off Do not disturb mode quickly, press either end of the Volume key when the screen is on and then touch TURN OFF NOW.

#### Set Do Not Disturb Mode Preferences

You can set allowed and blocked disturbances, or manage rules

that turn on or off silent mode automatically.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Sound > Do Not Disturb preferences.
- 2. Touch an option to configure.
  - Priority only allows: Set allowed disturbances when Do not disturb mode is set as Priority only.
  - Automatic rules: Touch an existing rule to set or delete it, or touch Add more to create new rules.
  - Block visual disturbances: Set the condition for blocking notifications on the screen.

#### **Applying New Wallpapers**

You can set the wallpaper for the home screen and the lock screen.

- Touch and hold an empty area on the home screen and then touch WALLPAPERS.
- Slide left or right to select an image as the wallpaper. You can also touch My photos to choose a picture as the wallpaper. Touch HOME or LOCK to preview the wallpaper.

# **Changing the Screen Brightness**

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Display > Brightness level.
- 2. Drag the slider to manually adjust the screen brightness.

#### NOTE:

With the proximity and light sensor, your phone can automatically adjust the screen brightness for available light. Touch **Adaptive brightness** in the Display settings screen to turn the feature on or off.

# Protecting Your Phone With Screen Locks

You can protect your phone by creating a screen lock. When it is enabled, you can swipe up on the lock screen, and then draw a pattern or enter a numeric PIN or password to unlock the phone's screen and keys.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Security & location > Screen lock.
- 2. Touch None, Swipe, Pattern, PIN, or Password.
  - ▶ Touch None to disable screen lock protection.
  - Touch Swipe to enable screen lock and allow unlocking with a "swipe" gesture. You can unlock the screen by touching the display and sliding up.
  - Touch Pattern to create a pattern that you must draw to unlock the screen.
  - Touch PIN or Password to set a numeric PIN or a password that you must enter to unlock the screen.
- 3. For Pattern, PIN, or Password, select how you want notifications and their contents to show when the phone is

locked.



Remember the pattern, PIN, or password you set. Otherwise, you will have to upgrade the phone software to use the phone (see <u>Upgrading the Phone Software</u>).

# **Using Fingerprints**

#### Register a Fingerprint

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Security & location > Fingerprint.
- 2. Touch Fingerprint management.
- Draw the pattern, or enter the PIN/password if you have already set the screen lock method.
- Touch REGISTER in the Add fingerprint message box when it prompts.
- Press one of your fingers on the fingerprint sensor at the back of your phone. After feeling the slight vibration, raise your finger and then press your finger on the sensor again.
- Repeat step 5 until your fingerprint has been registered.
- 7. Touch OK.
- NOTE:

You can touch **Add fingerprint** in the **Fingerprint management** screen to add more fingerprints.

#### **Set Fingerprint Actions**

With the registered fingerprint, you can turn on/unlock the screen or open a bound application when the screen is off or locked.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Security & location > Fingerprint > Fingerprint management.
- Draw the pattern, or enter the PIN/password if you have already set the screen lock method.
- 3. You can do the following settings:
  - Switch on Wake up and unlock your phone to set waking up or unlocking your device via a fingerprint.
    - NOTE:

If the screen is off or locked, press one of your registered fingers on the fingerprint sensor to quickly turn on/unlock the screen.

- ► Touch Quick launch app. Touch Fingerprint1, for instance. Swipe up and down to choose one app. Touch
  - onext to the app. You can set more fingerprints to quick-open your desired apps.
  - NOTE:

If the screen is off or locked, press the registered **Fingerprint1** on the fingerprint sensor to quickly launch the app.

It is convenient and fast to take a photo or answer the phone call by pressing the finger (registered or not) on the fingerprint sensor. Also, you can do more just by swiping your finger on the fingerprint sensor.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Security & location > Fingerprint.
- 2. You can do the following settings.
  - Take photo: If you slide on the switch, you can open the Camera app, and press one of your fingers (registered or not) on the fingerprint sensor to quickly shoot a photo.
  - Answer call: If you slide on the switch, you can press one
    of your fingers (registered or not) on the fingerprint sensor
    to quickly answer an incoming call.
  - View notification drawer: If you slide on the switch, you can swipe down on the fingerprint sensor from any screen to unfold notification drawer; swipe up to fold it.
  - View recent apps: If you slide on the switch, you can swipe up on the fingerprint sensor for recent apps when viewing the home screen.
  - View pictures: If you slide on the switch, you can launch Gallery and then swipe left or right on the fingerprint sensor to view pictures.

# **Using Face Detection**

You can use face detection to unlock the screen without entering the specific PIN/password, or drawing the pattern.

#### Create My Face for Face Detection

- Touch the Home key and swipe up on the screen. Touch Settings > Security & location > Face Verify.
- Draw the pattern, or enter the PIN/password. Select one screen-unlocking method from Pattern, PIN or Password if you haven't set yet.
- Disclaimer for Face Detect appears while you use the face detection at the first time. Touch CONTINUE. Find a spot that is neither too bright nor too dim. Touch CREATE NOW.
- Keep your face 20 cm to 50 cm away from the screen. Wait for a moment until the phone has created the face successfully.

#### NOTES:

- You can touch Attemptation of verification in the Face Verify screen, and put your face in front of the screen to confirm whether the created face works or not.
- Touch Create again in the Face Verify screen to recreate your face and erase the former one at the mean time.

#### **Enable Unlocking Screen via Face Detection**

 Touch the Home key and swipe up on the screen. Touch Settings > Security & location > Face Verify.

- 2. Draw the pattern, or enter the PIN/password.
- Switch on Unlock screen.

#### NOTE:

When the screen is locked, find a spot that is neither too bright nor too dim and keep your face 20 cm to 50 cm away from the screen to unlock the screen via face detection. If it doesn't work, touch to unlock screen via face detection.

# Protecting Your Phone With Screen Pinning

You can use the screen pinning feature to keep an app in view, so others cannot switch to other apps or access your personal information.

#### **Turn On Screen Pinning**

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Security & location > Screen pinning.
- 2. Touch the On/Off switch.
- To add security for unpinning, switch on Lock device when unpinning, select a security option with or without your fingerprint, and follow the on-screen instructions to set up a screen lock and register your fingerprint if needed.
   If you have set a screen lock with or without your fingerprint,

you can switch on **Ask for unlock pattern/PIN/password before unpinning**. You will need to draw the pattern, enter
the PIN/password, or use your registered fingerprint to unlock
the screen when unpinning the screen.

#### Pin a Screen

- Ensure that screen pinning is turned on.
- 2. Open the app you want to keep in view.
- 3. Touch the Recent apps key.
- If there are many app tabs, swipe up to find on the front-most tab
- 5. Touch .

#### **Unpin the Screen**

- To unpin the screen and return to normal use, touch and hold the Back key.
- If the screen is locked, press your registered finger on the fingerprint sensor, or swipe up on the lock screen and draw the pattern or enter the PIN/password depending on your screen lock and fingerprint settings.

# **Knowing the Basics**

### **Monitoring the Phone Status**

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides phone and service status icons on the right side. Below are some of the icons you may see.

# Managing Notifications

The status bar at the top of the home screen provides notification icons on the left. Below are some of the icons you may see.

## Open/Close the Notification Panel

Notifications report the arrival of new messages, calendar events, and alarms, as well as ongoing events. You can open the notification panel to view the details of notifications.

- To open the notification panel, swipe your finger down on the home screen or from the top of the screen.
- To close the notification panel, swipe your finger up on the screen or touch the Back key.

# Respond to or Remove a Notification

In the notification panel, you can respond to a notification or remove the notifications. The notification panel also supports

expandable notifications that let you perform additional actions right from the notification itself.

- To respond to a notification, touch it.
- Slide down with one finger to expand certain notifications.
   You can also swipe two fingers vertically or pinch-zoom to expand or collapse certain notifications.
- · To remove a notification, swipe it left or right.
- To remove all notifications, touch CLEAR ALL at the end of the list of notifications
- To manage notifications you have received, touch and hold a notification. You can touch MORE SETTINGS to configure notification options for this app.

## **Use Quick Settings**

The quick settings in the notification panel make it convenient to view or change the most common settings for your phone.

Swipe down with two fingers from the top of the screen, or open the notification panel and drag the panel downward to view the following quick settings.

- Brightness: Uncheck AUTO and drag the brightness slider to adjust the screen brightness.
- Wi-Fi: Touch to turn on or off Wi-Fi. Touch and hold to access the Wi-Fi menu. See <u>Connecting to Wi-Fi</u>.
- Bluetooth: Touch to turn on or off Bluetooth. Touch and hold to access the Bluetooth menu. See <u>Connecting to Bluetooth</u> <u>Devices</u>.

- Sound/Vibrate/Silent: Touch to switch between sound, vibration and silent mode. See <u>Switching to Silent or Vibration</u> <u>Mode</u>.
- Location: Touch to turn location services on or off. Touch and hold to access the Location menu.
- · Battery saver:
- · Flashlight: Touch to turn on or off the flashlight.
- Airplane mode: Touch to turn on or off airplane mode.
- Data: Touch to enable or disable data access over the mobile network. Touch and hold to access the Data usage menu.
- Auto-rotate/Portrait: Touch to turn on or off the auto-rotate screen feature.
- · Power-saver: Touch to turn on or off Power-saver.
- Ultra Power-saver: Touch to turn on or off Ultra Power-saver.
- Mobile Hotspot: Touch to enable the mobile hotspot feature and create a mobile hotspot. Touch and hold to access the Mobile Hotspot menu. See <u>Sharing Your Mobile Data</u> <u>Connection</u>.
- Do not disturb / Alarms only: Touch to turn on Do not disturb mode and select options. Touch and hold to open the Do not disturb menu. (See Using Do Not Disturb Mode.)
- Dolby: Turn on or off Dolby sound effect. And do more settings.
- Sync: Touch to turn on or off auto-syncing of accounts data.
   Touch and hold to access the Accounts menu. See Accounts.

- Data Saver: Turn on or off Data Saver. To help reduce data usage, Data Saver prevents some apps from sending or receiving data in the background.
- Invert colors: Touch to invert colors.
- Cast: Touch to search for devices, such as TVs, projectors or other devices that support wireless display and project your phone's content wirelessly to that device. You need to turn on Wi-Fi first. For detailed introduction, please refer to the device manual.
- · Screenshot: Touch to take a screenshot.
- NOTE:

In the quick settings screen, touch  $\overset{\bullet}{\sim}$  at the bottom right to access the Settings menu; touch  $\overset{\bullet}{\sim}$  to change control switch position.

# **Managing Shortcuts and Widgets**

### Add a Shortcut

- 1. Swipe up on the home screen
- 2. Drag an application to a home screen panel to add a shortcut.
- NOTE:

While holding the item, you can drag it to the right edge of the screen to create a new home screen panel and put the item on it.

# Add a Widget

- Touch and hold an empty area of the home screen and select WIDGETS.
- 2. Slide to browse the available widgets.
- 3. Touch and hold a widget and drag it to a home screen panel.

## Move Shortcuts or Widgets

- Touch and hold a shortcut or a widget on the home screen.
- 2. Drag it to the place you need.

### Remove Shortcuts or Widgets

- 1. Touch and hold a shortcut or a widget on the home screen.
- 2. Drag it to X to remove it.
- NOTE:

When there are more than two home screen panels, no panel can be left empty. If the shortcut, widget, or folder is the only item on the current home screen panel, the panel will be deleted as you remove the item.

## **Adjust Widget Size**

- Touch and hold a widget on the home screen and then release it.
- An outline appears around the widget. Drag the outline to resize the widget.

### MOTE:

Not all widgets can be resized.

# **Organizing With Folders**

You can create folders on the home screen and add several shortcuts to a folder.

You can move or remove folders the same way as moving or removing shortcuts.

- On the home screen, touch and hold the shortcut you want to add into a folder.
- Drag the shortcut to . A new folder will be created and the shortcut is added into the folder.
- To add more shortcuts into the folder, touch and hold each shortcut and drag it over the folder before releasing it.

### NOTES:

- To remove a shortcut from a folder, touch the folder to open it.
   Touch and hold the shortcut and drag it to the home screen.
- Touch the folder and then touch the Folder field to rename the folder

# Rearranging the Primary Shortcuts ok

The home screen includes a customizable primary shortcuts area at the bottom of all home screens. You can keep up to five items

in the primary shortcuts area. Drag shortcuts or folders in or out of the area to rearrange the area.



# Entering Text

You can enter text using the on-screen keyboard. Some apps open it automatically. In others, you open it by touching where you want to type. You can touch the Back key to hide the on-screen keyboard. You can also enter text by speaking with the Google voice typing feature.

## Enable or Disable Input Methods

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > System > Languages & input > Virtual keyboard > Manage keyboards.
- 2. Touch a keyboard in the list to enable/disable it as an option for entering text.
- NOTE:

Some default input methods may not be disabled.

## Change Input Methods

 When you use the on-screen keyboard to enter text, the icon appears at the bottom right of the screen.





- The icon appears only when more than one virtual keyboard is installed and enabled for use.
- 2. Touch and select the input method you need.

### Gboard

The Gboard provides a layout similar to a desktop computer keyboard. When screen auto-rotation is enabled, turn the phone sideways and the keyboard will change from portrait to landscape. The landscape keyboard is not supported in all applications.



- Touch the alphabetic keys to enter letters. Touch and hold some specific keys to enter associated accented letters or numbers. For example, to enter È, touch and hold the available accented letters and number 3 appear. Then slide to choose È.
- As you enter a word, candidates appear above the keyboard.
   Touch the correct one to select it.

current case you are using.

- Touch 
   \infty to delete the text before the cursor.
- Touch ?123 to select numbers and symbols. You can then touch = \ < to find more.</li>
- Touch to enter miniature icons.
- Touch to use Google voice typing.
- Touch and hold to change the input languages or set up the Gboard.
- Touch and hold , and slide to to change to a smaller keyboard for easier one-handed typing. Touch / to switch to the left-hand or right-hand keyboard, respectively.
   Touch to switch back to the full-sized keyboard.
- Touch and hold , and slide to to manage the Gboard settings.

### Glide Typing

The Gboard supports the glide typing feature. You use this feature to input a word by sliding through the letters.

### To enable and use glide typing:

- On the Gboard, touch and hold > .
   Or, swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > System > Languages & input > Virtual keyboard > Gboard
- 2. Touch Glide typing > Enable glide typing if this feature is

turned off.

Move your finger from letter to letter on the keyboard to trace a word without lifting the finger until you reach the end of the word.



### NOTES:

- Touch when you want to. If you want to enter a single letter, simply touch the key once.
- Lift your finger at the end of the word. A space is added automatically when you begin to input the next word.

# **Google Voice Typing**

Google voice typing uses the Google voice recognition service to convert speech to text. You must have a data connection on a mobile or Wi-Fi network to use it.

- Touch to access the voice typing feature when you are using Gboard.
- When you see the microphone image, speak what you want to type.
- You can continue entering text or touch an underlined word to change or delete it.

## NOTE:

Say "comma," "period," "question mark," "exclamation mark," or "exclamation point" to enter punctuation.

## Input Method Settings

Choose the input method settings by touching **Settings > System > Languages & input > Virtual keyboard**. Touch an option to choose the settings for that input method.

# **Editing Text**

- Move the insertion point: Touch where you want to type.
   The cursor blinks in the new position, and a tab appears below it. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- Select text: Touch and hold or double-tap within the text.
   The nearest word highlights, with a tab at each end of the selection. Drag the tabs to change the selection. Touch SELECT ALL to select all the text, touch SHARE and choose an option.
- Cut or copy: Select the text you want to manipulate. Then touch CUT or COPY to cut or copy the text to the clipboard.

- Replace text with the clipboard text: Select the text you want to replace. Then touch PASTE.
- Insert clipboard text in the text field: Touch the tab below the cursor. Then touch PASTE.



# Opening and Switching Apps

## Open an App

Touch a shortcut on the home screen or swipe up on the home screen and touch an app to open it.

## NOTES:

- Drag the slider on the right side of the screen to the initial letter of the app you need, or touch the search box at the top to search for apps.
- Touch in the search box to sort the apps alphabetically, by frequency, or by time.

# Switch Between Recently Opened Apps

- Touch the Recent apps key. A list of the names and thumbnails of apps you've recently used opens. If you've been using more apps recently than can fit on the screen, you can scroll the list up and down.
- Touch a thumbnail to open that app.

## NOTES:

You can swipe a thumbnail left or right or touch X on the

thumbnail to remove it from the list. Touch Clear all to remove all thumbnails.

 Double-tap the Recent apps key to switch to the most recent app you used.

# **Using Two Apps in Split-Screen Mode**

You can work with two apps at the same time in split-screen mode.

## NOTE:

Some apps may not support split-screen mode.

 Open the first app you want to use and then touch and hold the Recent apps key. The screen is divided into two.

-or-

Touch the **Recent apps** key to view your recently used apps, touch and hold the tab of the app you want to use and drag it to the **Drag here to use split screen** area.

If the app you need is in the recent apps list, touch it to set it as the second app. Or touch the **Home** key and swipe up on the home screen to find the app you need and open it as the second app.

To turn off split-screen mode, touch and hold the **Recent apps** key, or drag the handle to the edge of the screen.

# Uninstalling or Disabling an Application

- Swipe up on the home screen to open the application list screen.
- Touch and hold an application icon and drag the icon to
   Uninstall or Disable at the top of the screen.
- 3. Touch **OK** to uninstall or disable the app.

## NOTES:

- Preinstalled apps cannot be uninstalled, and not all apps can be disabled.
- To find the disabled applications, touch Settings > Apps & notifications. Touch See all 32 apps (for instance). Touch 

  ✓ and select Disabled apps. You can then touch an application and touch ENABLE to enable it.

# Connecting to Networks and Devices

# Connecting to Mobile Networks

### Control Mobile Data Use

#### To enable or disable data access:

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Mobile network.
- Slide the Mobile Data switch to enable or disable mobile data use

### To get data services when roaming:

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Mobile network.
- Slide the **Data roaming access** switch to enable or disable roaming.

### NOTE:

Data roaming may incur significant roaming charges.

### Select Preferred Network Type

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Mobile network > Preferred network type.
- 2. Touch the type of network you prefer to connect to.

# NOTE:

The **Preferred network type** option is displayed only when this feature is available. Please check with your operator whether this feature is available.

### **Check Access Point Names**

You can use the default Access Point Names (APNs) to connect to the Internet. Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Mobile network > Access Point Names to check the default APN.

# NOTE:

To set the APN to default settings, touch > Reset to default.

## Select Network Operator

 Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Mobile network > Network operators to search for all available networks.

## NOTE:

Touch **SEARCH NETWORKS** to search for all available networks again.

Touch a network in the network list to register manually. You can also touch Choose automatically to select preferred network automatically.

# Connecting to Wi-Fi®

Wi-Fi is a wireless networking technology that can provide Internet access at distances of up to 300 feet (100 meters), depending on the Wi-Fi router and your surroundings.

### Turn Wi-Fi On and Connect to a Wi-Fi Network

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Wi-Fi
- Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position to turn on Wi-Fi
- Touch a network name to connect to it.
- If the network is secured, enter the password and touch CONNECT.
- NOTE:

Your phone automatically connects to previously used Wi-Fi networks when they are in range.

### **Get Notified of Open Networks**

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Wi-Fi.
- Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- Touch Wi-Fi preferences, and slide the Wi-Fi notification switch to the On position.

When Wi-Fi is on, you receive notifications in the status bar when your phone detects an open Wi-Fi network. Slide the **Wi-Fi** notification switch to the **Off** position to turn off notifications.

### Add a Wi-Fi Network

You can add a Wi-Fi network if the network does not broadcast its name (SSID) or to add a Wi-Fi network when you are out of range.

To connect to a secured network, you first need to get the security details from the network's administrator.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Wi-Fi.
- Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- Touch Add network.
- Enter the network SSID (name). If necessary, enter security or other network configuration details.
- Touch SAVE.

## Forget a Wi-Fi Network

You can make your phone forget about the details of a Wi-Fi network that you added – for example, if you don't want the phone to connect to it automatically or if it is a network that you no longer use.

Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Wi-Fi.

- Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- Touch Saved networks.
- 4. Touch the Wi-Fi network name and then touch FORGET.

### Connect to a WPS Network

Wi-Fi Protected Setup (WPS) is a feature that makes it easy to add your phone to the access points that support WPS.

You can use one of the following methods to connect your phone to a wireless network using WPS.

### Method one: WPS button (Recommended)

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Wi-Fi.
- Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- 3. Touch Wi-Fi preferences > Advanced > WPS Push Button.
- Press the WPS button on the wireless router and the access point will recognize your phone and add it to the network.

#### Method two: PIN

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Wi-Fi.
- Slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- 3. Touch Wi-Fi preferences > Advanced > WPS Pin Entry.

The WPS PIN displays on the screen. Enter the PIN into the access point's setup page.

After entering the PIN, your phone automatically finds the access point and configures the connection.



For detailed information about the WPS feature of the access point, please refer to its user manual.

### Adjust Advanced Wi-Fi Settings

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Wi-Fi > Wi-Fi preferences > Advanced.
- 2. Touch \$\frac{1}{4}\$ to adjust the following settings.
  - Show Wi-Fi popups: When opening apps, show popups of Wi-Fi availability.
  - Avoid bad Wi-Fi connections: Use the mobile network whenever the Wi-Fi network you're connected to has no Internet connection.
  - Install certificates: Install certificates needed for connecting to certain Wi-Fi networks.
  - Network rating provider: Select the provider of Wi-Fi network safety ratings.
  - Wi-Fi Direct: Use the Wi-Fi Direct feature.
  - WPS Push Button: Connect to a WPS network via the push button method.
  - WPS Pin Entry: Connect to a WPS network via the

phone PIN method.

- MAC address: Check the MAC address.
- ▶ IP address: Check the phone's IP address.

# Connecting to Another Device via Wi-Fi Direct®

Wi-Fi Direct allows Wi-Fi devices to share files and data directly by connecting to each other without the need for wireless access points (hotspots).

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Wi-Fi.
- If Wi-Fi is off, slide the Wi-Fi switch to the On position.
- Touch Wi-Fi preferences > Advanced > Wi-Fi Direct. Your phone will search for other devices enabled with Wi-Fi Direct connections.
- Touch a device name below Peer devices to connect with it.
   The other device will receive a connection prompt and need to accept the request for connection. Both devices may need to enter a common PIN.
- Once connected the device is displayed as "Connected" in the **Peer devices** list.

# Connecting to Bluetooth® Devices

Bluetooth® is a short-range wireless communication technology. Phones or other devices with Bluetooth® capabilities can exchange

information wirelessly within a distance of about 30 feet (10 meters). The *Bluetootth*® devices must be paired before the communication is performed.

### Turn Bluetooth® On/Off

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Connected devices > Bluetooth.
- Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On or Off position.

When Bluetooth® is on, the \* icon will appear in the status bar.

## Change the Device Name

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Connected devices > Bluetooth.
- Slide the Bluetooth switch to the On position if Bluetooth<sup>®</sup> is off.
- Touch Device name.
- Edit the name and touch RENAME.

### Pair With Another Bluetooth® Device

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Connected devices > Bluetooth.
- Slide the **Bluetooth** switch to the **On** position if Bluetooth is off.
- Touch Pair new device.

Your phone automatically scans for and displays the IDs of all available *Bluetooth*® devices in range.

- 4. Touch the device you want to pair with.
- If necessary, confirm that the Bluetooth® passkeys are the same between the two devices and touch PAIR. Alternatively, enter a Bluetooth® passkey and touch PAIR.

Pairing is successfully completed when the other device accepts the connection or the same passkey is entered.

### NOTE:

The *Bluetooth*<sup>®</sup> passkey may be fixed for certain devices, such as headsets and hands-free car kits. You can try entering 0000 or 1234 (the most common passkeys) or refer to the documents for that device.

## Forget a Bluetooth® Device

You can make your phone forget its pairing connection with another *Bluetooth*<sup>®</sup> device. To connect to the device again, you need to search for it and enter or confirm a passkey again.

- Swipe up on the home screen. Touch Settings > Connected devices > Bluetooth and ensure that Bluetooth® is turned on.
- In the list of paired devices, touch beside the Bluetooth device you want to forget.
- 3. Touch FORGET.

### Send Data via Bluetooth®

- Open the appropriate application and select the file or item you want to share.
- Select the option for sharing via Bluetooth®. The method may vary by application and data type.
- Touch a Bluetooth® device the phone has paired with or wait for it to search for new devices and touch one of them.

### Receive Data via Bluetooth®

- Turn Bluetooth® on before trying to receive data via Bluetooth®
- When prompted, touch ACCEPT to start receiving the data. If necessary, swipe down on the Status Bar to locate the prompt.

Received files are stored automatically in a dedicated folder (*Bluetooth*, for instance) in the phone storage or microSDXC card. You can access them in the File Manager app.

# **Connecting to Your Computer via USB**

You can connect your phone to a computer with a USB cable and transfer music, pictures, and other files in both directions. Your phone stores these files in the internal storage or on a removable microSDXC card.

## Connect Your Phone to a Computer via USB

Connect your phone to the PC with a USB cable.

- The Use USB to screen opens. Or you can open the
  notification panel and touch the notification with
  to open
  the Use USB to screen.
- Choose one of the following options in the Use USB to screen:
  - ▶ Charge this device: Charge your phone via USB.
  - Transfer files: Transfer files to another device (MTP).
  - Transfer photos (PTP): Transfer photos or files if MTP is not supported (PTP).
  - Install driver: Automatically install driver on your PC.

# Disconnect Your Phone From the Computer

To disconnect the phone from the computer, simply unplug the USB cable when you're finished.

# Using the microSDXC Card as Portable or Internal Storage

You can use your microSDXC card as portable storage to save photos, music, videos, downloaded files, and more.

If your microSDXC card is new or doesn't have content you want to keep, you can also set it up as an extension of the phone storage, and this requires formatting that prevents the microSDXC card from working with other devices.

### CAUTION:

As part of the internal storage, the microSDXC card may have

data on it that is necessary for some apps to function normally. Therefore, do not remove or replace the card randomly.

# Set Up the microSDXC Card as Portable Storage

When you install a microSDXC card that has not been used on your phone before, the phone will mount the card as portable storage by default.

### To remove the microSDXC card from your phone:

If you need to remove the microSDXC card used as portable storage while the phone is on, you must unmount it first.

- 1. Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Storage.
- When the screen prompts the card is safely ejected, you can remove it from the phone.

#### To erase and format the microSDXC card:

- 1. Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Storage.
- 2. Touch the SD card name in the **Portable storage** section.
- 3. Touch : > Storage settings. Touch Format.
- 4. Touch ERASE & FORMAT.

### CAUTION:

The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSDXC card, after which the files CANNOT be retrieved.

# Set Up the microSDXC Card as Internal Storage

If your microSDXC card is new or doesn't have content you want to keep, you can format the card for use as part of the internal storage. If you move the microSDXC card to another device, it'll be formatted before it can be used.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Storage.
- 2. Touch the SD card name in the Portable storage section.
- 3. Touch : > Storage settings > Format as internal.
- 4. Touch ERASE & FORMAT.

### CAUTION:

The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSDXC card, after which the files CANNOT be retrieved.

 The phone will prompt you to move your photos, files and other data from the phone to the microSDXC card. Select Move now or Move later and touch NEXT. Follow the onscreen instructions to continue.

### To move data between the phone and the microSDXC card:

With the microSDXC card as part of the internal storage, you can move your photos, files and other data between the phone and the card any time.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Storage.
- 2. Touch Internal shared storage or the SD card name.
- 3. Touch > Migrate data.

#### 4. Touch MOVE.



Whenever you move data between the phone and the microSDXC card, the destination is used to save new apps and personal data (such as photos and videos) and only the destination is accessible from a computer.

### To remove the microSDXC card from your phone:

If you need to remove the microSDXC card used as internal storage while the phone is on, you must unmount it first.

- 1. Swipe up on the home screen and touch **Settings > Storage**.
- 2. Touch your SD card name below Device storage.
- 3. Touch > Eject. Touch EJECT.
  - NOTE:

Before ejecting the card, ensure that you have moved data and apps to the phone.

4. When the screen prompts the card is safely ejected, you can remove it from the phone.

### To reformat the microSDXC card as portable storage:

If you no longer want to use your microSDXC card as internal storage, you can reformat the card as portable storage.

### NOTE:

Before the formatting, ensure that you have moved data and apps to the phone.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Storage.
- Touch your SD card name below Device storage.

- 3. Touch > Format as portable.
- Touch FORMAT.
- 5. Touch DONE when it is finished.
- CAUTION:

The formatting procedure erases all the data on the microSDXC card, after which the files CANNOT be retrieved.

# Sharing Your Mobile Data Connection

You can share your phone's data capabilities through USB tethering, *Bluetooth*<sup>®</sup> tethering, or by activating the mobile hotspot feature to create a Wi-Fi hotspot.

### Share Your Mobile Data Connection via USB

You can access the Internet on your computer via the USB tethering feature of your phone. The feature needs data connection on a mobile network and may result in data charges.

### NOTE:

You cannot transfer files between your phone and your computer when the phone is USB tethered.

- Connect your phone to your computer with a USB cable.
- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Tethering & Mobile Hotspot.
- Switch on USB tethering. A new network connection will be created on your computer.

# NOTE:

To stop sharing your data connection, switch off **USB tethering** or disconnect the USB cable.

### Share Mobile Data Connection via Bluetooth

If your computer can obtain an Internet connection via Bluetooth, you can configure your phone to share its mobile data connection with your computer.

- 1. Pair your phone with your computer via Bluetooth.
- Configure your computer to obtain its network connection via Bluetooth. For more information, please see your computer's documentation.
- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Tethering & Mobile Hotspot.
- Switch on Bluetooth tethering. Your computer is now sharing your phone's data connection.
- NOTE:

To stop sharing your data connection, switch off **Bluetooth tethering**.

## Share Mobile Data via Mobile Hotspot

You can share your phone's data connection with other devices by turning your phone into a mobile hotspot. The feature requires a data connection on a mobile network and may result in data charges.

NOTE:

When the mobile hotspot feature is enabled, you cannot use your phone's Wi-Fi capability to access the Internet. You still remain connected to the Internet via your mobile data network.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Tethering & Mobile Hotspot > Mobile Hotspot.
- Slide the switch to the On position. (If Wi-Fi was active, touch OK to deactivate it.) After a moment, the phone starts broadcasting its Wi-Fi network name (SSID).
- 3. On another device, locate your phone via Wi-Fi and connect with it to start using the phone's mobile data.

### NOTE:

To stop sharing your data connection, slide the switch to the **Off** position.

## Set Up Your Mobile Hotspot

You can change your phone's Wi-Fi network name (SSID), secure your mobile hotspot, and set other options.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > Tethering & Mobile Hotspot > Mobile Hotspot.
- 2. Touch an option to configure the following settings.
  - Configure:
    - Network name: Enter or edit a network name (SSID) that other devices see when scanning for Wi-Fi networks.

- Security: Choose a security option: Open (not recommended) or WPA2 PSK (other users can access your hotspot only if they enter the correct password).
   When you select WPA2 PSK, touch the Password field to edit the security password.
- Show password: If you have chosen WPA2 PSK security, check to show or uncheck to hide the password.
- Broadcast network name (SSID): Check to broadcast or uncheck to hide your network name (SSID). If the broadcast is disabled, other users need to know your network SSID to find the mobile hotspot.
- Show advanced options: Check to select an 802.11 mode.
- Manage users: Block or unblock users, or set the maximum number of devices that can connect to the hotspot simultaneously.
- Sleep policy: Set hotspot sleep policy and notification.

# **Connecting to Virtual Private Networks**

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions to let people access local network resources when not on campus, or when connected to a wireless network.

Depending on the type of VPN you are using, you may be

required to enter your login credentials or install security certificates before you can connect to your VPN. You can get this information from your network administrator.

# NOTE:

You need to set a lock screen pattern, PIN, or password before you can use a VPN.

### Add a VPN

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > VPN.
- Touch + and enter the VPN name.
- Select the VPN type, enter the server address and other information provided by your network administrator. Check Show advanced options to fill out additional details.
- 4. Touch SAVE.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN screen.

### Connect to a VPN

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network & Internet > VPN.
- 2. Touch the VPN that you want to connect to.
- When prompted, enter any requested credentials and then touch CONNECT.

## Modify a VPN

Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Network

### & Internet > VPN.

- 2. Touch seside the VPN that you want to modify.
- 3. Edit the VPN settings and then touch SAVE.

# **Phone Calls**

You can place calls from the Phone app, the Contacts app, or other apps or widgets that display contact information. Wherever you see a phone number, you can usually touch it to dial.

# Placing and Ending Calls

## Place a Call by Dialing

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > • •
- Enter the phone number or the contact name with the dial pad. Touch to delete incorrect digits or symbols.
  - NOTE:

As you enter the phone number or contact name, your phone searches for matching information in your contacts. If you see the number and contact you want to call, touch it to place the call immediately.

3. Touch below the keypad to dial.

You can also touch the search box at the top of the Phone app screen and enter the phone number or contact name you want to call. Touch the matching contact or **Call [number]** to place the call.

# NOTES:

 To make an international call, touch and hold the 0 key to enter the plus (+) symbol. Next, enter the country code followed by the city/area code and then the phone number.

### End a Call

During a call, touch on the screen.

# **Answering or Rejecting Calls**

When you receive a phone call, the incoming call screen opens, displaying the Caller ID or the information about the caller that you've entered in the Contacts app. You can answer or reject the call, or reject it with a text message.

### Answer a Call

To answer an incoming call,



- If the phone screen is active, touch ANSWER.
- If the phone screen is locked, slide up.
- If the phone screen is locked, slide u
   NOTF:

To silence the ringer before answering the call, press the **Volume** key or the **Power** key.

# Reject a Call

To reject an incoming call,



- If the phone screen is active, touch DECLINE.
- If the phone screen is locked, slide oown.

You can also reject the call and select a preset text message or write one to send to the caller.



- If the phone screen is active, touch MESSAGE.
- If the phone screen is locked, slide up.
- NOTE:

To edit the preset text responses from within the Phone app, touch \* > Settings > Quick responses.

# Working With the Call History

The call history is a list of all the calls you've placed, received, or missed. It provides a convenient way to redial a number, return a call, or add a number to your Contacts.

To open the call history, touch the **Home** key > \( \bar{\sqrt{9}} > \( \bar{\sqrt{1}} \) (in the top search field) > **Call history**.

### Place a Call From the Call History

- Open the call history.
- Touch a number for more information about the call, or touch beside it to call back.
- NOTE:

You can touch **MISSED**, **INCOMING**, or **OUTGOING** to filter the records by call type.

### Save a Call History Number to a Contact

- 1. Open the call history.
- 2. Touch a number.
- Touch to create a new contact, or touch to add the number to an existing contact, and follow the on-screen instructions.

### Take Other Actions on a Call History Entry

- 1. Open the call history.
- Touch a number or a contact, and then touch Call details to view more call information. While viewing the call details, you can:
  - ▶ Touch to delete the entry.
  - ▶ Touch □ to copy the phone number.
  - Touch Edit number before call to edit the number in the dialer before calling it.
  - Touch the circle in front of the entry to open the contact information tab from the bottom of the screen. If the number is in your Contacts, you can send a message, call back, or add the contact to favorites. If the number is not saved, you can save it to Contacts, call back, or send a message.



You can touch \* > Clear call history in the call history screen to delete all history records.

# **Calling Your Contacts**

- Touch the Home key >
- Touch the tab with . Your favorite contacts and frequently called contacts are displayed in the tab with . Touch a contact to place a call.

-or-

Touch the tab with . Your full contact list is displayed. Touch beside a contact to place a call.

# **Checking Voicemail**

If you have set the phone to divert calls to voicemail, callers can leave voicemail messages when they cannot reach you. Here's how to check the messages they left.

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > • .
- Touch and hold the 1 key in the dialer. If prompted, enter your voicemail password.
- Follow the voice prompts to listen to and manage your voicemail messages.

### NOTE:

See Set Voicemail for how to set your voicemail service. For

detailed information, please contact the service provider.

# **Using Options During a Call**

During a call, you will see a number of on-screen options. Touch an option to select it.

- Touch to make another call separately from the first call, which is put on hold.
- Touch to open the dial pad when you need to enter a code (for example, the PIN for your voicemail or bank account) during the call.
- Touch volume to mute or unmute your microphone.
- Touch to turn the speaker on or off.
- Touch to.open the Contacts app.
- Touch \$\iiii\] to put the caller you are speaking to on hold, and switch to the other call that has been put on hold.
- Touch T to merge the separate calls into a single conference call.
- Touch <u>T</u> to show the keyboard and the message screen to send and receive text messages.
- Touch to end the current call.

#### WARNING!

Because of higher volume levels, do not place the phone near your ear during speakerphone use.

# Managing Multi-party Calls

When the call waiting and three-way call features are available, you can switch between two calls or set up a conference call.

# NOTE:

Options and interface will vary. The call waiting and three-way call features need network support and may result in additional charges. Please contact your service provider for more information.

### Switch Between Current Calls

When you're on a call and another call comes in, your phone screen informs you and displays the caller ID.

### To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

- Touch ANSWER or slide up to answer the call. This places the first caller on hold and answers the second call.
- Touch DECLINE or slide down to reject the second call.
- Touch MESSAGE or slide up to reject the second call and select a preset text message or write one to send to the caller.

#### To switch between two calls:

Touch II.

### Set Up a Conference Call

With this feature, you can talk to two people at the same time.

- Place the first call.
- Once you have established the connection, touch \(\frac{1}{4}\) or \(\theta\). and dial the second number.
- 3. When you're connected to the second party, touch  $\lambda$ . If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all callers are disconnected.

To end the conference call, touch .



# **Adjusting Your Call Settings**

You can configure a number of settings for the Phone application.



Some call options are displayed only when these features are available, and some features require network support and may result in additional charges. Please contact your service provider for more information.

### **Set Contact Display Options**

You can set the order of the contacts displayed in the **CONTACTS** tab of the Phone app.

1. Touch the Home key > > i > Settings > Display options.

Touch Sort by or Name format to set the order of the contacts and the format of the contact names.

#### Set Sound and Vibration

Set the sound and vibration for incoming calls as well as dial pad sounds.

- Touch the Home key > Settings > Sounds and vibration.
- 2. Touch the option you want to configure.
  - Touch Phone ringtone to select the ringtone for incoming call notification.
  - Check Also vibrate for calls to enable vibration for incoming call notification.
  - Check Dialpad tones to play sounds when you touch the dial pad keys.

# **Set Options for Answering and Ending Calls**

When enabled, the options allow you to end a call by pressing the **Power** key or make the phone vibrate when a call is answered.

- Touch the Home key > Settings > Answer and end calls
- 2. Touch an option.
  - Check Power button ends call to enable ending calls by pressing the Power key.
  - ▶ Check Vibrate when call is answered to enable the

phone to vibrate when a call is answered.

### Set Speed Dials

You can touch and hold the 1~9 keys from the dial pad to call the corresponding speed dial number.

The number 1 key is reserved to speed dial your voicemail.

### To assign a speed dial key:

- Touch a speed dial key.
- Select one from the contact list.

# Edit Quick Response to Rejected Callers

- Touch the Home key > Settings > Quick responses.
- 2. Touch a text message to edit it.
- 3. Touch OK to save the message.

#### Set Voicemail

- 2. Touch Voicemail to configure voicemail settings.
  - Touch Advanced Settings > Service to select the voicemail service provider. Your carrier is the default.
  - Touch Advanced Settings > Setup to view or change the voicemail number.
  - Check Notifications > Vibrate to enable vibration for

- voicemail notifications.
- Touch Notifications > Sound to select the notification ringtone for new voicemails.

### **Forward Incoming Calls**

The call forwarding feature allows you to forward your incoming calls to another phone number.

- Touch the Home key > Settings > Call settings > Call forwarding.
- Touch Always forward, Forward when busy, or Forward when no answer as you need, and touch Activate.
- Enter the number that you want to forward to. Touch TURN ON to enable it.

#### **Block Certain Numbers**

The call blocking feature allows you to block calls and messages from certain numbers.

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Call blocking.
- Touch ADD A NUMBER.
- Enter a phone number or touch to select one from the contact list.
- 4. Touch BLOCK.



To unblock a number, touch X next to the number, and touch

#### UNBLOCK in the Blocked numbers menu.

#### Set Real-Time Text Mode

Real-Time Text (RTT) is text transmitted while it is being typed or created, with the character being sent immediately once typed, and also displayed immediately to the receiver. This means that the receiver can read the newly created text while the sender is still typing it. Real-Time Text is of particular importance for people who are deaf or hard of hearing as a replacement for voice telephony.

- Touch the Home key > > > Settings > Accessibility > Real Time Text.
- Slide the switch to the On position.
- Touch RTT mode.
- 4. Touch the option you want to configure.
  - Visible During Calls: During a call, you can touch T to show the keyboard and the message screen to send and receive text messages.
  - Always Visible: During a call, the keyboard and the message screen is always visible for you to send and receive text messages.

### **Set Hearing Aids**

Your phone supports Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) function. If you use a hearing aid with a telecoil and turn on hearing aid compatibility, it will help you hear more clearly during the phone calls.

- Touch the Home key > > Settings > Accessibility.
- 2. Check Hearing aids to turn on hearing aid compatibility.

#### CAUTION:

Do not turn on the Hearing aids option unless you use a hearing aid with a telecoil. Using this setting without a hearing aid or with a hearing aid without a telecoil may be harmful to your hearing.

### **Contacts**

You can add contacts on your phone and synchronize them with the contacts in your Google account or other accounts that support contact syncing.

To see your contacts, touch the **Home** key > 2.

# **Checking Contact Details**

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > **②**.
- 2. Scroll through the list to view all your contacts.
- Touch a contact to view its details.

# **Adding a New Contact**

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > \bigsimes.
- 2. Touch to add a new contact.
- Enter the contact name, phone numbers, and email addresses. Touch More fields to enter other information.
- 4. Touch SAVE to save the contact.

# **Setting Up Emergency Contacts**

To get help in an emergency, you need to provide your own emergency information and the contact information of someone close to you such as your spouse, parents, etc. Your In Case of Emergency (ICE) Contacts will be available for use even when your phone is locked.

#### To set up My Emergency Information:

- Touch the Home key > In Case of Emergency contacts
- Touch My Emergency Information. Edit your emergency information.
- 3. Touch \( \square \) to save.
  - NOTE:

If a profile has been set up, touch My Emergency

Information and touch \* > Edit to modify the information.

#### To set up emergency contacts:

Touch the Home key > In Case of Emergency contacts.

 Touch > New contact to add a new emergency contact, or touch to select a contact as an emergency contact.

#### To access ICE contacts when the phone is locked:

- Press the Power key to turn the screen on.
- 2. Swipe up on the screen and touch EMERGENCY.

# Importing, Exporting, and Sharing Contacts

You can import/export contacts. This is especially useful when you need to transfer contacts between different devices. You can also quickly share your contacts using *Bluetooth*, Email, Gmail, Google Drive, or Messages.

### Import Contacts

- 1. Touch the **Home** key >  $\bigcirc$  >  $\bigcirc$  > **Settings**.
- 2. Touch Import > .vcf file.
- 3. Choose the vCard file(s) you would like to import.

### **Export Contacts**

1. Touch the **Home** key >  $\bigcirc$  >  $\bigcirc$  > **Settings**.

- Touch \* > Export > Export to .vcf file.
- The phone will prompt you with the name of the vCard file. Touch SAVE to create the file.

#### **Share Contacts**

- Touch the Home key > <sup>3</sup>
- 2. Touch and hold the contact you want to share.
- 3. Touch to select more contacts if needed, and then touch <.
- Choose how to share the contacts. The options available depend on the applications and services installed.

### NOTE:

You can also share your contacts by choosing **Share all contacts** in the Export contacts menu.

# **Working With Favorite Contacts**

You can add the contacts you use frequently to **FAVORITES** so that you can find them quickly.

#### Add a Contact to Favorites

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > **②**.
- 2. Touch a contact and then touch  $\stackrel{}{\not\sim}$  at the top of the screen.

### Remove a Contact From Favorites

- 1. Touch the **Home** key >  $\bigcirc$ .
- Touch a favorite contact and then touch \*

# **Working With Groups**

### Set Up a New Group

- 1. Touch the **Home** key >  $\bigcirc$  >  $\bigcirc$  > **Create label**.
- 2. Touch the Label name field and enter a name. Touch OK.
- Touch ADD CONTACTS and select the contacts you wish to be the group members. Touch ADD.

### NOTES:

- Touch <sup>+</sup>
   to add contacts to an existing group.
- Touch > Remove contacts and touch next to the contact that you want to remove from the group.

# **View Your Contact Groups**

- 1. Touch the **Home** key >  $\bigcirc$  >  $\equiv$ .
- 2. View the labels for groups.
- 3. Touch a label to view the group members.

### NOTE:

To send messages or emails to the group members, touch \$ > Send email or Send message.

### Delete a Group

- Touch the Home key > > ■.
- 2. Touch a label and then touch : > Delete label.
- Touch **OK** to disband the group. The contacts in the group will not be deleted.

### Rename a Group

- Touch the Home key > <sup>6</sup> > ≡.
- Touch a label and then touch > Rename label to edit the group name.
- 3. Touch OK.

# **Searching for a Contact**

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > and then touch Q to search.
- Enter the contact name or other information (such as phone number) you want to search for. The contacts matched will be listed.

# **Editing Contacts**

#### **Edit Contact Details**

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > 👶.
- Touch a contact and then touch .
- 3. Edit the contact and touch SAVE.

### Delete Contacts ok

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > 🕘.
- 2. Touch and hold the contact you want to delete.
- 3. Check more contacts if needed, and then touch .
- 4. Touch OK to confirm.

#### **Link Contacts**

As your phone synchronizes with multiple online accounts, you may see duplicate entries for the same contact. You can merge all the separate information of a contact into one entry in the Contacts list.

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > 🖰.
- 2. Touch a contact.
- Touch > Link.
- Touch the contact whose information you want to link with the first entry.

#### NOTES:

- The information from the second contact is added to the first contact, and the second contact is no longer displayed in the contacts list.
- You can link another contact to the main contact by touching
   View linked contacts > ADD and choosing a contact you want to link with the main contact.

#### Unlink Contact Information

If contact information from different sources was linked by mistake, you can separate the information back into individual contacts on your phone.

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > **②**.
- 2. Touch a linked contact you want to unlink.
- 3. Touch > View linked contacts > UNLINK.
- 4. Touch UNLINK to confirm.

### **Accounts**

# **Adding or Removing Accounts**

You can add multiple Google accounts and Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync® accounts. You may also add other kinds of accounts, depending on the apps installed on your phone.

#### Add an Account

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Accounts > Add account.
- 2. Touch the type of account you want to add.
- Follow the on-screen steps to enter the information about the account. Most accounts require a username and password, but the details may vary. You may also need to obtain some information from IT support or your system administrator.

When the account is successfully added, it is displayed by categories in the Accounts menu in Settings.

#### Remove an Account

Removing an account will delete it and all information associated with it, such as emails and contacts, from your phone.

Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings >

#### Accounts.

- Touch the account you'd like to remove and touch REMOVE ACCOUNT.
- 3. Touch REMOVE ACCOUNT.

# **Configuring Account Sync**

### Configure Auto Sync Setting

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Accounts.
- Switch on or off Automatically-sync data to enable or disable automatic sync.
  - When automatic sync is turned on, changes you make to information on your phone or on the web are automatically synced with each other.
  - When automatic sync is turned off, you need to sync manually to collect emails, updates, or other recent information.

### Sync Manually

 Swipe up on the home screen and touch Settings > Accounts.

- 2. Touch the account you want to sync.
- Touch Account sync. The screen shows a list of information the account can sync.
- Touch a listing to sync that type of information between the phone and the web. Or touch > Sync now to sync all the types of information as you need.

### **Email**

Swipe up on the home screen and touch . Use it to read and send emails from Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync, Outlook, Yahoo!®, AOL, and more.

# Setting Up the First Email Account

Swipe up on the home screen and touch



- 2. Select an email server and enter the email address and password.
- 3. Touch **NEXT** to let the phone retrieve the network parameters automatically.



You can also enter these details manually by touching MANUAL SETUP or if automatic setup fails.

4. Follow the on-screen instructions to finish setup.

Your phone will show the inbox of the email account and start to download email messages.

# Checking Your Emails

Your phone can automatically check for new emails at the interval you set when setting up the account.

You can also check new emails manually by dragging down on

the message list.

# Writing and Sending an Email

Open your email Inbox and touch .



### NOTE:

If you have more than one email account added on the phone, touch the From field to select the account you want to use for sending the message.

2. Enter a contact name or an email address in the To field. Separate each recipient with a comma. You can also touch + to select recipients from CONTACTS, GROUPS or

#### HISTORY. NOTE:

To send a carbon copy or a blind carbon copy to other recipients, touch  $\vee$  beside the **To** field to open the Cc/Bcc fields and enter contact names or email addresses.

- Enter the email subject and compose the email text.
- Touch to add audio files, images, videos, and other types of files as attachments.
- 5. Touch at the top right of the screen to send the message.

# Responding to an Email

You can reply to or forward a message that you receive. You can also delete messages and manage them in other ways.

### Reply to or Forward an Email

- 1. Open the email you want to reply to or forward from the Inbox.
- 2. Choose one of the following:
  - ➤ To reply to the sender, touch ♠.
  - To reply to the sender and all recipients of the original message, touch
  - ▶ To forward the email to someone else, touch ...
- Edit your message and touch ▶.

#### Mark an Email as Unread

You can return a read email to the unread state – for example, to remind yourself to read it again later. You can also mark a batch of emails as unread.

- While reading a message, touch \*> Mark unread.
- While in a message list (for instance, the inbox), touch the sender image before the message and then touch

#### Delete an Email

You can delete an email from its folder. You can also delete a

batch of emails.

- While reading a message, touch \( \big| \).
- While in a message list (for instance, the Inbox), touch the sender image before the message and then touch



If you accidentally delete an email, touch UNDO to retrieve it.

# Adding a Signature to Your Emails

You can set a few lines of plain text as a signature for every outgoing email message from an account, such as your name and contact information.

- 1. Open the Email app.
- Touch > Settings and select the account you want to add a signature to.
- 3. Touch Signature and enter the text.
- 4. Touch OK.

# **Adding and Editing Email Accounts**

#### Add an Email Account

After setting up your first email account (see <u>Setting Up the First Email Account</u>), you can add more email accounts and manage them separately.

- 1. Open the Email app.
- Touch > Settings > Add account.
- 3. Set up the account as you did with the first one.

#### **Edit an Email Account**

You can change a number of settings for an account. The options you can configure depend on the type of account.

- 1. Open the Email app.
- Touch > Settings and touch the account whose settings you want to change.
- Make the changes you want and touch or the Back key when you're finished.

#### Remove an Email Account

- Open the Email app.
- Touch > Settings and touch the account you want to remove.
- 3. Touch Remove account from this device > OK.

# **Changing General Email Settings**

General settings apply to all email accounts you add.

- 1. Open the Email app.
- Touch > Settings > General settings.

 Make the changes you want and touch ← or the Back key when you're finished.

# Messages

Touch the **Home** key > . You can use Messages to exchange text messages (SMS) and multimedia messages (MMS).

# **Starting a Conversation**

- Touch the Home key > 

  .
- 2. Touch Start chat.
- Enter the name, phone number, or email of the person you're sending a message to.
- Type your message. If you want to send a multimedia message, touch to attach photos, audio files, video files, etc. to the message.
- 5. Touch sms/mms.
- NOTE:

Do not add any attachment if you want to send a text message. Otherwise you may be charged for a multimedia message.

# Replying to a Message

Messages you receive are appended to existing threads of the same number. If the new message comes from a new number,

a new thread is created.

- In the Messages screen, touch the thread that has the message you want to reply to.
- Type your reply in the **Text message** field at the bottom.
   You can touch fi you want to reply with an MMS.
- 3. Touch sms/mms.

# **Changing Message Settings**

Touch **\* > Settings** in the **Messages** screen to change the settings.

### Calendar

Calendar on the phone works with the web-based Google Calendar™ service for creating and managing events, goals, and reminders. It also works with the Microsoft Exchange ActiveSync calendar once you sign in to your Exchange account on the phone.

To open Calendar, swipe up on the home screen and touch Calendar.

# **Viewing Your Calendars and Events**

### **Change Calendar Views**

You can view your calendars in different forms. The app offers five view types: Month, Week, 3 Day, Day, and Schedule.

To change calendar views, touch  $\equiv$  at the top left and select the view you prefer.

- In Month, Week, 3 Day, or Day view, swipe horizontally to see previous and future months, weeks, or days.
- In Schedule view, swipe vertically to see all your events.
- When you are viewing past or future days, weeks, or months, touch at the top to quickly switch to today.

#### View Goal/Reminder/Event Details

In Schedule, Day, 3 Day, or Week view, touch a goal, a

reminder, or an event to view its details.

In Month view, touch a day to view goals, reminders, or events on that day, and then touch to view the details.

# Creating a Goal, a Reminder, or an Event

- 2. Follow the prompts to finish the details.

#### NOTES:

- You can also touch a spot in 3 Day, Day or Week view twice to add an event to that time spot.
- You can open the Goal/Reminder/Event details screen, and touch of to change the details.

# **Changing Calendar Settings**

To change the calendar settings, touch  $\equiv$  > Settings.

You can touch **General** to change general settings, which apply to all accounts. Or touch other settings that only apply to specific accounts.

To be updated with your Google+ contacts' birthdays, you need to configure the **Events from Gmail** setting to make sure they show up on your calendar.

If you've saved events on Gmail like birthdays, or holidays, the information can be added automatically to your calendar after you manage the **Birthdays** settings or the **Holidays** Settings.

### **Browser**

Use Chrome to view web pages and search for information.

# **Opening the Browser**

Touch the **Home** key > 

to launch the web browser. The browser also opens when you touch a web link – for example, in an email or a text message.

- Open the Chrome app and touch the Search or type web address field.
- Enter the address (URL) of a web page, or enter terms you want to search for.
- Touch a URL or search suggestion or touch the enter key on the keyboard to open the web page or search results.

# **Using Multiple Browser Tabs**

You can open several web pages at the same time (one page in each tab) and switch between them freely.

# Open a New Browser Tab

Touch 1 > . The number shows how many tabs you have opened.

#### Switch Between Browser Tabs

- Touch 2 (the number shows how many tabs you have opened).
- Titles of opened tabs appear as a list. Touch a thumbnail to switch to that tab.
- NOTE:

Swipe a title horizontally or touch X to close the tab.

# **Downloading Files**

- Touch and hold an image or a link to a file or to another web page.
- In the menu that opens, touch **Download image** or **Download link**

The downloaded files are saved to your phone or the microSDXC card. You can view or open them in the Downloads app.

# Changing Browser Settings

You can configure a number of settings to customize the way you browse the web, including several that you can use to control your privacy.

To open the Chrome settings, touch > Settings in the browser screen.

# Camera

You can take photos and record videos. Photos and videos are stored on the microSDXC card, if you have installed one, or to the phone's internal storage. You can copy them to your computer or access them in the Gallery app.

# Capturing a Photo

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > .
- 2. Aim the camera at the subject and make any necessary adjustment. PHOTO (automatic camera) mode is used by default.
- Touch the area on the screen where you want the camera to focus, or let the camera autofocus on the center of the image.
- 4. Touch to take a photo.

### WARNING!

Keep a safe distance when using the flash. Do not point the flash toward the eyes of people or animals.



Number	Function
1	Change the HDR setting (back camera only).
2	Change the camera/video settings.
3	Switch among PHOTO mode, VIDEO mode, and MANUAL mode.
4	View pictures and videos you have taken.

Number	Function
7	Use special photo or video camera modes: PANORAMA, TIMELAPSE, and COLLAGE.
8	Select a special effect for pictures and videos.
9	Enable or disable LIVE photo.
10	Change the flash setting (back camera only).

## NOTES:

- You can pinch or spread your fingers on the screen to zoom in or out before taking a picture.
- In PHOTO mode, when you touch the screen to focus, the exposure bar appears beside the focus point. You can drag up or down to adjust the exposure.

# **Using Manual Camera Mode**

You can use Manual camera mode to adjust more camera options for your photo.

- Aim the camera at the subject. You can make the following adjustments.
  - Drag the green square to any area on the screen that you want to focus on. Touch and hold it to lock the focus.
  - Drag the yellow circle to any area on the screen where you want the camera to meter exposure so as to adjust the photo brightness. Touch and hold the circle to lock

exposure.

- Touch S0 and drag the slider on the arc orbit to adjust the light sensitivity.
- ► Touch and drag the slider on the arc orbit to adjust the exposure level.
- ► Touch ① and drag the slider on the arc orbit to adjust the interval for time-lapse pictures.
- 3. Touch to take the photo.

# **Using Other Camera Modes**

Besides capturing photos and videos in the traditional way, your Camera app offers other powerful and interesting camera modes. Touch ••• in the viewfinder screen to find them.

- PANORAMA: Capture panorama pictures.
- TIMELAPSE: Set the time interval between each frame when you record time-lapse videos with the back camera.
- COLLAGE: Capture two pictures separately and combine them into one picture, either of them taking up a half of the combined picture.

# **Recording a Video**

- 1. Touch the **Home** key > VIDEO.
- Aim the camera at the subject and make any necessary adjustments. You can touch any area on the screen that you want the camcorder to focus on before and during recording.
- Touch to start recording. You can also touch to pause or resume recording, or touch to save the frame as a photo.
- 4. Touch 
  to stop recording.

## NOTES:

- You can pinch or spread on the screen or press the Volume key to zoom in or out before and during recording.
- When you touch the screen to focus during recording, the exposure bar appears beside the focus point. You can drag up or down to adjust the exposure. Touch and hold the focus point to lock the focus.
- To capture a time-lapse video, touch ... > TIMELAPSE.
   Drag the slider on the arc orbit to adjust time interval. Then touch to begin recording and to stop. You can also touch to save the frame as a photo.

# Customizing Camera and Video Settings

Before capturing a photo or a video, you can touch so to open the following options.

## NOTE:

Some camera and video options will change in different camera modes.

- Resolution: Set the image size for your photos.
- Volume key: Assign the function of the Volume key for the Camera app: Take photo, Zoom, or Volume.
- Timer: Set a time delay before the camera takes a picture automatically after you touch the shutter icon.
- · Water mark: Apply a watermark to your photo.
- Composition: Show or hide the grid or golden spiral to help with balanced photo composition.
- · Gradienter: Show or hide the gradienter.
- Point-and-shoot: (front camera only) When this feature is enabled, you can touch the viewfinder screen to take a photo in SELFIE mode.
- Smile: (front camera only) Turn on or off smile detection in SELFIE mode.
- Mirror image: (front camera only) When enabled, allows you to capture a mirror photo in SELFIE mode.

- Selfie indicator: (front camera only) When enabled, shows a selfie indicator in order to capture natural expressions in SELFIE mode.
- Shutter tone: Turn the shutter tone on or off.
- Geo-tagging: When enabled, store the GPS location in your captured photos and videos.
- Anti-banding: Set the anti-banding value when you take pictures of TV or computer screens to avoid stripes on the screen.
- Save location: Change the storage location for captured photos and videos.
- Help: Enable the Help icon on the viewfinder screen, or touch More to view help details.
- Restore defaults: Restore default camera and video settings.
- Video quality: Set the quality for your video.
- Metering: Adjust the light metering setting in MANUAL mode.

# **Gallery**

# **Opening Gallery**

Touch the **Home** key > wo to view your pictures and videos. Touch **PHOTOS** or **ALBUMS** tab to select a viewing mode. **PHOTOS** displays contents in chronological order, and **ALBUMS** displays contents organized by album.

# **Working With Albums**

#### View Album Contents

Touch **ALBUMS** and then touch an album to view the pictures and videos it contains

## Share Albums, Pictures, or Videos

- Touch and hold an item in the album view to select an album, or after you open an album, to select a picture or a video.
- 2. Touch more items that you want to share.
- 3. Touch sand select how you want to share the items.

## NOTE:

Album sharing may not be available for certain albums.

## Delete Albums, Pictures, or Videos

- Touch and hold an item in the album view to select an album, or after you open an album, to select a picture or a video.
- 2. Touch more items that you want to delete.
- 3. Touch > DELETE.

#### **Hide Albums**

- 1. Touch > Settings > Album filter and touch a folder.
- Touch more albums that you want to hide. The default albums such as Camera and My videos albums cannot be hidden.

# NOTE:

To show the hidden albums again, touch > Settings > Album filter. Touch the filtered albums you want to restore.

# **Working With Pictures**

Touch a picture in an album to view the picture in full screen. Pinch two fingers together on the picture to zoom out. Double-tap the picture, or spread fingers apart to zoom in. Double-tap the picture that has been zoomed in to restore to the original size. Slide left or right to view other pictures.



Number	Function
1	Touch to return to the album, where all its contents are displayed in a grid.
2	Share the picture.
3	Delete the picture.
4	Touch to rename, print, or rotate the picture, set it as wallpaper, contact photo, etc., check file details, or browse the album contents in a slideshow.
5	Edit the picture.

## NOTES:

- Pinch a picture or video to make it smaller. You'll then see a filmstrip-style view of all your pictures and videos in a row.
   Swipe left or right to scan through them all.
- You can delete a picture or video by touching > DELETE
  or by swiping it up in the filmstrip view. If you accidentally
  delete one by swiping it up, touch Undo to retrieve it.
- Not all options may be available for certain albums or pictures.

# **Retouching Your Pictures**

You can edit any photos you took and some other pictures in Gallery with Photo Editor. The changed picture is saved in the same album as the original one, while the original is never affected.

- While viewing a picture in full screen, touch the screen and touch to open Photo Editor.
- Touch the icons along the bottom of the screen to edit the picture.

*	Apply filters, old photo (nostalgia), and blur effects.
4	Crop, rotate, or flip (mirror) the picture.
	Adjust exposure, contrast, shadows, sharpness, and other light options.

===	Adjust color of the picture.
	Select a color and draw anything on the picture, or add some text or mosaics to the picture and adjust the effect.

- 3. Touch  $\checkmark$  to keep the change or  $\times$  to cancel it.
- 4. Touch to save the new picture.
- NOTE:

Touch in the **Photo Editor** screen to see the edits you have made and undo or redo them.

# Making a GIF or a Collage

You can put together a few pictures in the same album to make an animated GIF or a collage of pictures.

- Open the Gallery app and touch SGIF maker or Collage maker
- 2. Touch an album.
- Touch the pictures you want. You can exit the album and open other albums to add more pictures.
  - To make a GIF, touch 2 to 50 pictures in the order (or reverse of the order) that you want them to appear in the GIF.
  - To make a collage, touch 2 to 9 pictures.

The pictures you touched are displayed along the bottom of the screen. Touch to remove the pictures you do not want.

- 4. Touch NEXT. The GIF or collage is displayed.
- Touch the options along the bottom to adjust the final picture.
  - For GIF, you can adjust the speed, order, and size. Touch MORE to adjust each picture, and then touch MANAGE FRAME to add/remove pictures or adjust their order.
  - For collage, touch TEMPLATE, FREE, or COLLAGE and then select a border, shading, and style.
- When you are satisfied with the final picture, touch to save the GIF or touch to save the collage.

Depending on your storage setting, the picture is saved in the picture\_editor/GIF folder or picture\_editor/Collage folder in your phone storage or your microSDXC card.

# **Playing Videos**

- Touch an album in Gallery, and then touch the thumbnail of a video.
- 2. Touch at the center and select a player to start playing the video (take the Photos app for example).

- Touch the video to view the playback controls. You can touch the following options.
  - Touch to share the video via Bluetooth, Gmail, Messages, etc.
  - ► Touch to stabilize or rotate the video.
  - ▶ Touch to view the details such as video size, storage location, etc.
  - ► Touch to move the video to trash.
  - ▶ Touch or to pause or resume playback.

# Music

Swipe up on the home screen and touch **Music** to play audio files stored on your phone. Music supports a wide variety of audio formats, so it can play music you purchase from online stores, music you copy from your CD collection, and more.

# **Viewing Your Music Library**

Open Music, and your music library is displayed.

- Touch All songs to view all music files on your phone. Your music is organized by ALL SONGS, ARTISTS, ALBUMS, and GENRE.
- Touch Favorites to browse music files you have marked as favorites.
- Touch Recently played to view the music files you have recently played.
- Touch Folders to find music files through the folders they are stored in.
- All music playlists you have created are listed under My playlist.

# NOTE:

If an audio file is being played, its name and player controls are displayed at the bottom of the screen. Touch the area to open the playback screen.

# Setting a Song as the Default Ringtone

The song will be used as the ringtone for all incoming calls.

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Music > All songs to see the music library.
- 2. Touch next to a song in any list.
- 3. In the menu that opens, touch Set as ringtone.
- Touch Phone ringtone or Notification ringtone. You can set a part of the song (duration 40 s) or the whole song as the ringtone. Touch SET AS RINGTONE.

# NOTE:

If the song is being played and you're in the playback screen, you can touch \* > Set as ringtone.

# **Playing Music**

Touch a song in the music library to listen to it. Touch the playback bar at the bottom of the screen to open the following playback screen.



Number	Function
1	Touch to go back to the music library.
2	Song, album, and artist information.
3	Add the song to your favorites, or remove it from favorites.
4	Turn shuffle on or off.
5	Drag the slider to jump to any part of the song.
6	Playback control. Skip songs, or pause / resume playback.
7	Turn on or off Dolby sound effect.

8	Toggle repeat mode: repeating the current song, repeating all songs on the list, or sequential.
9	Access additional options.
10	Touch to see the current playlist.

You can still control the music when you are not in the playback screen.

- In other apps, swipe down the notification panel. Touch the song title to restore the playback screen, or you can pause/resume playback or skip songs.
- When the screen is locked, the song information, album cover, and playback controls are displayed on the lock screen. Touch the song title to restore the playback screen, or you can pause/resume playback or skip songs.

# **Managing Playlists**

Create playlists to organize your music files into sets of songs, so that you can play the songs you like in the order you prefer.

#### To create a new playlist:

 Touch next to My playlist. Enter the name and touch SAVE.

#### To add songs to a playlist:

 Touch > Add to next to a song to add it to a playlist or create a new playlist. Touch a playlist and touch
 > Add = s. Check songs
 you want to add to the list and touch

#### To delete a playlist:

Touch a playlist and touch > Delete.

#### To rename a playlist:

• Touch a playlist and touch > Rename.

#### To view a playlist:

· Touch a playlist to view its content.

#### To remove songs from a playlist:

 Touch and hold the song. Touch additional songs to select multiple songs for removal and then touch 

.

#### To play a playlist:

• Touch next to a playlist.

## **Video**

Swipe up on the home screen and touch **Video** to manage your video library and to watch videos.

# Opening the Video Library

Open Video to view your video library. Swipe up or down to find the video you want. You can also touch Search to search for video files, or touch Sort to change the display mode or sort the list.

# **Playing and Controlling Videos**

Touch a video in the video library to play it. Touch the screen to show the playback controls. You can control the video and audio or carry out other operations.



Number	Function
1	Return to the video library list.
2	Hide video playback controls and lock the touch screen.
3	Drag the slider to jump to any part of the video.
4	Change the video size (fit to screen or full screen).
5	Playback control: Skip videos, or pause and resume playback.
6	Touch to turn into a small floating window for video playing.

Hamber	Function
7	Share, delete, or rename the video, view the details of the video, or configure the settings.
8	Turn on or off Dolby sound effect.

#### NOTES:

- Slide horizontally on the video to rewind or fast forward.
- Slide vertically on the right or left part of the screen to adjust volume or brightness, respectively.
- Touch or to skip to the previous or the next video.

# Managing Video Files

#### Delete Videos

- 1. In the video library, touch and hold a video.
- 2. Touch the videos you want to delete.

# Share Videos

- 1. In the video library, touch and hold a video.
- 2. Touch the videos you want to share.
- 3. Touch sand select how you want to share them.

#### Trim a Video

- 1. Touch a video to start playing it.
- 2. Touch > Trim.
- Drag the two tabs on the progress bar to select the portion you want to keep. You can touch to preview the selected portion.
- Stop the preview and touch Stop the preview and touch saved as a new yideo file.

#### Rename a Video

- 1. In the video library, touch a video you want to rename.
- Touch > Rename.
- 3. Type the new video name and touch OK.

## View Details of a Video

- In the video library, touch a video you want to view its details.
- Touch > Details.
- Touch OK to close the window.

# **Voice Recorder**

Swipe up on the home screen and touch **Voice Recorder** to record voice memos and listen to them whenever you like.

# **Recording a Voice Memo**

- Swipe up on the home screen and touch Voice Recorder.
- 2. Touch to select a file format.
- Touch to start recording. Touch to pause and to continue recording. Touch to add flags as you need.
- 4. Touch DONE to stop recording.
- 5. Type the name and touch SAVE.

# Playing a Voice Memo

- Touch at the top right of the screen to see all recordings.
- 2. Touch the title of a memo to play it.

# NOTE:

You can also touch at the right of the memo to delete, share, rename, edit, check its file information, or set it as your phone ringtone or notification ringtone.

# **More Apps**

## Calculator

Swipe up on the home screen and touch **Calculator** to use the phone's convenient built-in calculator for some basic as well as advanced mathematical equations.

## NOTE:

To see more calculator options, swipe left while holding the phone in portrait view or turn the phone to landscape view.

## Clock

Swipe up on the home screen and touch **Clock**. The Clock app allows you to check local time in places around the world, set alarms, and use timers.

#### Set a New Alarm

- 1. Open the Clock app and touch ①.
- Touch a default alarm to configure it, or touch at the bottom of the screen to create a new alarm. Touch OK.
- Set up the alarm options, such as time, alarm days, snooze, and alarm ringtone.

## NOTE:

To enable or disable existing alarms directly, touch the switches

on the right side of each alarm.

#### Use World Time

- World time lets you check local times for cities around the world. Touch of to add a new city.

# **Using Stopwatch and Countdown Timer**

Stopwatch allows you to record lap times, while countdown timer allows you to set a time and count down to zero.

#### To use stopwatch:

- 1. Open the Clock app and touch  $\bar{\mathbb{O}}$ .
- 2. Touch .
- NOTES:
- Touch SHARE to share the stopwatch data in html format.
- · Touch LAP to record lap times.
- Touch RESET to reset the stopwatch.

#### To use countdown timer:

- Open the Clock app and touch X.
- Set a timer and touch to count down.
- NOTE:

You can touch **ADD TIMER** to add more countdown timers and touch to count down simultaneously. Slide up and down on

the TIMER screen to view all the timers you have set. Touch

DELETE to delete the timer. Touch

to stop the countdown.

NOTE:

Touch \* > Settings to configure alarm settings, clock settings and timers settings.

## **Downloads**

The Downloads app keeps a record of the files you have downloaded using apps such as Chrome or Email.

Swipe up on the home screen and touch Downloads.

- Touch a file to open it with the appropriate application.
- Touch and hold a file to delete or share it.

# File Manager

Quickly access all of your images, videos, audio clips, and other types of files on your phone, or the memory card.

Swipe up on the home screen and touch **File Manager**. Touch **CATEGORY** to find the file you need by category, or touch **LOCAL** to browse folders and files on the phone storage, or the microSDXC card.

- Touch folders and files to access stored items.
- Touch + to create a new folder in the current directory.

- Touch and hold a folder or file for options: share , delete
   and more options .
- · To copy or move an item:
  - 1. Touch and hold the folder or file and touch .
  - 2. Touch Copy or Move.
  - Navigate to a new location or touch New folder within File Manager and touch PASTE.

# **Google Apps**

## NOTE:

Some Google services may not be available in your region.

- Chrome: Use the Chrome app to browse the Internet and get your bookmarks, browsing history, and more synced with your Google account.
- Drive: Store files on Google servers for free after you sign in to your Google account. You can access them on your computers, your phones, and other devices, share them, or collaborate with others.
- Duo: Make a simple video call or an audio-only call using Wi-Fi or mobile data.
- Gmail: Send and receive emails via your Gmail account or other personal email accounts.

- Google: Use Google search or get information when you need it with Google feed.
- Maps: Find your place and find your way in the world.
- Photos: Manage photos on the phone and your Google account.
- Play Movies & TV: Purchase, download and watch movies and TV shows.
- Play Music: Play music on the phone and on your Google account.
- Play Store: Purchase and download apps, games, and more from the Google Play store.
- YouTube<sup>TM</sup>: Watch video clips from YouTube.com, or upload your own and share with the world.

# **Settings**

Swipe up on the home screen and touch **Settings**. It contains most of the tools for customizing and configuring your phone.

# **Airplane Mode**

In the Settings app, touch **Airplane mode > Airplane mode** to turn airplane mode on or off. All the phone's radios that transmit voice or data are turned off when airplane mode is on.

## **Network & Internet**

#### Wi-Fi

Turn Wi-Fi on or off and configure your Wi-Fi connections (see *Connecting to Wi-Fi*).

## **Mobile Network**

Control mobile data use, select network types or operators, and configure access point names (see <u>Connecting to Mobile</u> <u>Networks</u>).

# **Data Usage**

Check and manage mobile data use. You can view and restrict Wi-Fi data usage as well.

- Touch Data saver to enable Data saver which prevents apps from using data connection in the background. For an app you're currently using, it can access data, but may do so less frequently when Data saver is enabled. You can also touch Unrestricted data access and allow some apps to always have access to data connection even when Data saver is turned on.
- Touch Display in GB/MB to change the data unit displayed.
- Touch the Mobile data switch to turn on or off mobile data.
- Touch the Alert me switch to turn on or off data usage warning.
- Touch the Limit switch to turn on or off data usage limit.
   Mobile data connection will be turned off when you've used designated amount of data.
- Touch Mobile data usage to check how much data has been used during the time cycle you set, see what apps have been using mobile data, restrict background data for individual apps, or allow unrestricted data usage when Data saver is on for individual apps.
- Touch Billing cycle to set the reset date of the data usage cycle, and set mobile data warning and limit.
- Touch Wi-Fi data usage to view the Wi-Fi usage of apps.
- Touch Network restrictions to select Wi-Fi networks that are mobile hotspots. Apps may warn before using these networks for large downloads to avoid high mobile data bills.

## NOTE:

The data usage is measured by your phone, and your carrier's data usage accounting may differ.

## **Tethering & Mobile Hotspot**

Share your phone's mobile data connection with PCs or other devices via USB, Bluetooth or Wi-Fi. See <u>Sharing Your Mobile Data Connection</u>.

## **VPN**

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network. See <u>Connecting to Virtual Private Networks</u>.

# **Call Settings**

Configure call forwarding. See Forward Incoming Calls.

## Roaming State

In the Settings app, **Network & Internet > Roaming state** shows the roaming state.

# **Emergency Alerts**

In the Settings app, touch **Network & Internet > Emergency alerts** to manage options for receiving emergency alert messages.

## **Connected Devices**

#### **Bluetooth**

Turn Bluetooth on or off and configure your Bluetooth connections.

# **Printing**

Configure Google Cloud Print service or other printer plug-ins installed from the Google Play Store or your printer.

#### **USB**

Select the USB connection mode between your phone and PC.

#### Chromebook

Connect to your phone from your Chromebook.

# **Apps & Notifications**

## **Notifications**

Set different notification options for individual apps. Touch App & notifications > Notifications > App notifications and touch an app to block or mute its notifications or allow its notification dot to show on the app icon.

# **App Permissions**

Check or change the app permissions.

# Default Apps

Check the apps' supported links, set whether to open the links in the apps, and set the default apps.

# **Special App Access**

Turn on or off apps' access to various services on your phone.

#### **Features**

# **Navigation Keys**

You can swap the positions of the **Back** key and the **Recent apps** key. Select an option to make the switch.

#### Scheduled Power On/Off

Set the day and time when the phone automatically powers on or off. You can also touch the switches on the right to turn the features on or off.

#### **Gesture & Motion**

You can control the phone with special finger gestures or moving the phone in different ways. Touch the switches to enable each function: touch each function to view how to use it

or try it out.

# **Battery**

View remaining battery power, check which items have been using the battery, and optimize battery use.

- Power-saver: When Power-saver is on, you can set up battery saving policies, and set the timer to enable Power-saver automatically, or allow the system to enable Power-saver on low battery.
- Ultra Power-saver: Disable all features including mobile data, Bluetooth, location services and vibration. Reduce brightness and the time the phone enters sleep. Only basic functions, such as phone call and messages are available.
- App Power-saver manager: Set the power saving policy for individual apps.

# **Display**

- Brightness level: Set the brightness of the display.
- Night Light: Night light tints your screen amber to make it easier to look at your screen or read in dim light.
- Adaptive brightness: Automatically adjust screen brightness.
- Wallpaper: Select a background image or animation for the home screen or lock screen.
- Sleep: Set the length of time of inactivity before the screen

- turns off automatically.
- Auto-rotate screen: Set the screen orientation to automatically change.
- Font size: Set the font size of the text on the screen.
- Display size: Adjust the display size of items including fonts, icons and images on the screen.
- Screen saver: Manage the Screen saver function, which can display colors or photos when the phone is docked or charging.
- Ambient display: Wake the phone from sleep when new notifications arrive.
- Calibration: Place the phone on a level surface and take a calibration test to calibrate the sensor.

## Sound

Adjust different types of volume, set notification mode, set Do not disturb options, set up ringtone and notification sound, turn on or off **Dolby Audio**, set up default alarm sound, or select system sounds.

# **Storage**

The Storage settings menu lets you check memory information for your microSDXC card and phone storage.

You can choose the default location for new data, such as photos captured and voice recorded. Touch **Saving location setting** and select to store items in the phone storage or the

installed microSDXC card.

Touch **Internal shared storage** to get a detailed breakdown of space usage by type. Touch a data type to see more information or delete the files you do not need.

For more information about using the phone storage and the microSDXC card, see <u>Using the microSDXC Card as Portable or Internal Storage</u>.

# **Security & Location**

 Screen lock: Set up a screen lock after which you must swipe on the phone, draw a pattern, or enter a PIN/password to access the phone (see <u>Protecting Your</u> <u>Phone With Screen Locks</u>).

Touch seside Screen lock to set the following options.

- Make pattern visible: Show the pattern as you draw it. This option is available when unlock pattern is set.
- Automatically lock: Set the time needed for the lock protection to be activated after the screen turns off, except when the phone kept unlocked by Smart Lock. This option is available when unlock pattern, PIN or password is set.
- Power button instantly locks: Lock protection is activated immediately when you press the Power key except when the phone kept unlocked by Smart Lock. This option is available when unlock pattern, PIN or password is set.

- Lock screen message: Set the text that you may display on the lock screen.
- Lock screen preferences: Set notification display rules on the lock screen, and set lock screen message.
- Fingerprint: With the registered fingerprint, you can turn
  on/unlock the screen or open a bound application when the
  screen is off or locked. It is convenient and fast to take a
  photo or answer the phone call by pressing the finger
  (registered or not) on the fingerprint sensor. Also, you can
  do more just by swiping your finger on the fingerprint sensor.
  See Using Fingerprints.
- Face Verify: You can use face detection to unlock the screen without entering the specific PIN/password, or drawing the pattern. See <u>Using Face Detection</u>.
- Smart Lock: Keep the phone unlocked when connected to trusted devices, in trusted places, when recognizing a trusted voice, or while being held or carried.

You must set a screen lock pattern, PIN, or password to use the Smart Lock feature.

- Location: Manage location services, which help your phone and apps determine your location. To use location-related applications, such as finding your location on Google Maps, you must have location services enabled on your phone.

battery power and get approximate location, choose **Battery saving**. To use only GPS to pinpoint your location, choose **Device only**.

- App-level permissions: Set which apps can access the location information.

- Use your PC to download an upgrade package to your microSDXC card and install it to your phone from the card.

## Radio Frequency (RF) Energy

This phone is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the United States.

During SAR testing, this device was set to transmit at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands, and placed in positions that simulate RF exposure in usage against the head with no separation, and near the body with the separation of 0.4 inches (10 mm). Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the device while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station antenna, the lower the power output.

The exposure standard for wireless devices employing a unit of measurement is known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC is 1.6 W/kg.

This device is complied with SAR for general population/uncontrolled exposure limits in ANSI/IEEE C95.1-1992 and had been tested in accordance with the measurement methods and procedures specified in IEEE1528.

The FCC has granted an Equipment Authorization for this model phone with all reported SAR levels evaluated as in compliance with the FCC RF exposure guidelines. For this device, the highest reported SAR value for usage

against the head is 0.42 W/kg, and for usage near the body is 0.99 W/kg.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the government requirements.

SAR compliance for body-worn operation is based on a separation distance of 0.4 inches (10 mm) between the unit and the human body. Carry this device at least 0.4 inches (10 mm) away from your body to ensure RF exposure level compliant or lower to the reported level. To support body-worn operation, choose the belt clips or holsters, which do not contain metallic components, to maintain a separation of 0.4 inches (10 mm) between this device and your body.

RF exposure compliance with any body-worn accessory that contains metal was not tested and certified, and use of such body-worn accessory should be avoided.

# Hearing Aid Compatibility (HAC) Regulations for Mobile Phones

In 2003, the FCC adopted rules to make digital wireless telephones compatible with hearing aids and cochlear implants. Although analog wireless phones do not usually cause interference with hearing aids or cochlear implants, digital wireless phones sometimes do because of electromagnetic energy emitted by the phone's antenna, backlight, or other components. Your phone is compliant with FCC HAC regulations (ANSI C63.19-2011).

While some wireless phones are used near some hearing devices (hearing aids and cochlear implants), users may detect a buzzing, humming, or whining noise. Some hearing devices are more immune than others to this interference noise and phones also vary in the amount of interference they generate. The wireless telephone industry has developed a rating system. for wireless phones to assist hearing device users in finding phones that may be compatible with their hearing devices. Not all phones have been rated. Phones that are rated have the rating on their box or a label located on the box. These ratings are not guaranteed. Results will vary, depending on the level of immunity of your hearing device and the degree of your hearing loss. If your hearing device happens to be vulnerable to interference, you may not be able to use a rated phone successfully. Trying out the phone with your hearing device is the best way to evaluate it for your personal needs.

This phone has been tested and rated for use with hearing aids

for some of the wireless technologies that it uses. However, there may be some newer wireless technologies used in this phone that have not been tested yet for use with hearing aids. It is important to try the different features of this phone thoroughly and in different locations, using your hearing aid or cochlear implant, to determine if you hear any interfering noise. Consult your service provider or the manufacturer of this phone for information on hearing aid compatibility. If you have questions about return or exchange policies, consult your service provider or phone retailer.

- Keep the screen and camera lens clean. An unclean screen or camera lens may slow down the phone's reaction to your operations or interfere with the image quality.
- Clean your phone and its accessories with a soft material such as cleaning cloth for eyeglass lenses. Do not use alcohol or other corrosive substances for cleaning or allow them to get inside.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to open flames or lit tobacco products.
- Do not expose your phone or its accessories to liquid, moisture or high humidity.
- Do not drop, throw or try to bend your phone or its accessories.
- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or aerosols to

clean the device or its accessories.

- Do not paint your phone or its accessories.
- Do not attempt to disassemble your phone or its accessories.
   Only authorized personnel can do so.
- Do not expose or use your phone or its accessories in an environment with or that can reach extreme temperatures, minimum 23°F (-5°C) and maximum 122°F (+50°C).
- Do not place your phone inside or near heating equipment or high-pressure containers, such as water heaters, microwave ovens, or hot cooking utensils. Otherwise, your phone may be damaged.
- Please check local regulations for disposal of electronic products.
- Do not carry your phone in your back pocket as it could break when you sit down.

#### Small Children

Do not leave your phone and its accessories within the reach of small children or allow them to play with it. They could hurt themselves or others, or could accidentally damage the phone. Your phone contains small parts with sharp edges that may cause an injury or may become detached and create a choking hazard.

### Demagnetization

To avoid the risk of demagnetization, do not allow electronic devices or magnetic media close to your phone for a long time.

### Electrostatic Discharge (ESD)

Do not touch the metal connectors on the nano-SIM card and the microSDXC card.

#### **Antenna**

Do not touch the antenna unnecessarily.

#### **Normal Use Position**

When placing or receiving a phone call, hold your phone to your ear, with the bottom towards your mouth.

### **Airbags**

Do not place a phone in the area over an airbag or in the airbag deployment area, as an airbag inflates with great force and serious injury could result. Store the phone in a safe and secure area before driving your vehicle.

#### Seizures/Blackouts

The phone can produce a bright or flashing light. A small percentage of people may be susceptible to blackouts or seizures (even if they have never had one before) when exposed to flashing lights or light patterns such as when playing games or

watching video. If you have experienced seizures or blackouts or have a family history of such occurrences, please consult a physician. To reduce the risk of blackouts or seizures, use your phone in a well-lit room and take frequent breaks.

### Repetitive Strain Injuries

To minimize the risk of Repetitive Strain Injury (RSI) when texting or playing games with your phone:

- Do not grip the phone too tightly.
- · Press the buttons lightly.
- Use the special features which are designed to minimize the times of pressing buttons, such as Message Templates and Predictive Text
- Take frequent breaks to stretch and relax.

### **Emergency Calls**

This phone, like any other wireless phone, operates using radio signals, which cannot guarantee connection in all conditions. Therefore, you must never rely solely on any wireless phone for emergency communications.

#### **Loud Noise**

This phone is capable of producing loud noises, which may damage your hearing. Turn down the volume before using headphones, *Bluetooth* headsets or other audio devices.

### **Phone Heating**

Your phone may become warm during charging and during normal use.

## **Electrical Safety**

#### Accessories

Use only approved accessories. Do not connect with incompatible products or accessories. Take care not to touch or allow metal objects, such as coins or key rings, to contact or short-circuit the charging port. Never puncture the surface of the phone with sharp objects.

#### Connection to Vehicles

Seek professional advice when connecting a phone interface to the vehicle electrical system.

### **Faulty and Damaged Products**

Do not attempt to disassemble the phone or its accessories. Only qualified personnel can service or repair the phone or its accessories. If your phone (or its accessories) has been submerged in water, punctured, or subjected to a severe fall, do not use it until you have taken it to be checked at an authorized service center.

## Radio Frequency Interference

#### General Statement on Interference

Care must be taken when using your phone in close proximity to personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids. Please consult your doctor and the device manufacturers to determine if the operation of your phone may interfere with the operation of your medical devices.

#### **Pacemakers**

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum separation of 6 inches (15 cm) be maintained between a mobile phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. To achieve this, use the phone on the opposite ear to your pacemaker and do not carry it in a breast pocket.

### **Hearing Aids**

People with hearing aids or other cochlear implants may experience interfering noises when using wireless devices or when one is nearby. The level of interference will depend on the type of hearing device and the distance from the interference source. Increasing the separation between them may reduce the interference. You may also consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

### **Medical Equipment**

Turn off your wireless device when you are requested to do so in hospitals, clinics or healthcare facilities. These requests are designed to prevent possible interference with sensitive medical equipment.

#### **Aircraft**

Turn off your wireless device whenever you are instructed to do so by airport or airline staff. Consult the airline staff about the use of wireless devices onboard the aircraft and enable airplane mode of your phone when boarding an aircraft.

#### Interference in Vehicles

Please note that because of possible interference with electronic equipment, some vehicle manufacturers forbid the use of mobile phones in their vehicles unless a hands-free kit with an external antenna is included in the installation.

## **Explosive Environments**

### **Gas Stations and Explosive Atmospheres**

In locations with potentially explosive atmospheres, obey all posted signs to turn off wireless devices such as your phone or other radio equipment. Areas with potentially explosive atmospheres include fueling areas, below decks on boats, fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities, and areas where the

air contains chemicals or particles, such as grain, dust, or metal powders.

#### **Blasting Caps and Areas**

Power off your mobile phone or wireless device when in a blasting area or in areas where signs are posted to power off "two-way radios" or "electronic devices" to avoid interfering with blasting operations.
